Styx, by the late 70s and early 80s, shot to stardom during the decades of big rockers and soaring power ballads. Over the course of their 40-year career they've released 15 studio albums, six best-of compilations and four live albums, garnering eight Top Ten singles. Styx has sold over 30 million albums worldwide. They've performed more live shows since 1999 than all of the previous years of their illustrious career combined.
