

Holliday who established Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway, and the world-famous Harvey Girls. One volunteer in this group was an actual Harvey Girl. The Fred Harvey Company and its employees, including the famous waitresses who came to be known as Harvey Girls, successfully brought new higher standards of both civility and dining to a region widely regarded in the era as "the Wild West."
